Try this at home...

Use old ice cream tubs or plastic trays
Try adding glitter/cereals to the jelly
Use spoons, yoghurt pots, lids, sieves, scoops, plastic cars and animals
Custard powder, corn flour, angel delight are also good to play with!
Remember to cover clothes & surfaces. (Cheap shower curtains are good for tables)



What is your child learning?

- To seek and delight in new experiences

- To count & use measurement language
- To ask questions, to use descriptive language, new vocabulary and talk about what they are doing
